The Southbank Centre is close to Waterloo Station, and is clearly signposted from the station. It is an accessible building, but do contact us if you have particular access needs.

Staff will accompany attendees from the Foyle Pavilion to the Queen Elizabeth Hall in the afternoon, where the rehearsal, pre-concert talk, and the concert will take place. During the scheduled breaks in the day, there is a wide variety of food and drink outlets in the Southbank Centre and nearby. You are also welcome to bring your own food and drink with you.
