Frances Gregory

Praised for her "idiomatic and stylish singing" (The Telegraph) British mezzosoprano Frances Gregory is a recent graduate of Royal Academy Opera and a current Rising Star of the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment.



She begins the 24/25 season as Alcandro L'Olimpiade with Vache Baroque and makes her debut as Cherubino Le Nozze di Figaro with The Mozartists at Cadogan Hall and Teatro Communale, Sicily, conducted by Ian Page.

During 2023 / 2024 she made her debut with The English Concert as Arnalta / Nutrice / Famigliare 1 L'incoronazione di Poppea at the Palau de la Musica, Barcelona and Auditorio Nacional, Madrid; with The Gabrieli Consort in J. S. Bach's B Minor Mass at the KKL Lucerne; and at The Grange Festival as Arnalta L'incoronazione di Poppea with La Nuova Musica. In Summer 2024, she created the role of Ellie Gifford in Paul Carr's Under the Greenwood Tree for Dorset Opera Festival. Concert work included Mozart Requiem at St Endellion Festival, Rossini Petite Messe Solennelle, Dido Dido and Aeneas with Eboracum Baroque and Purcell Songs with Bjarte Eike at the Royal Academy of Music.

Frances will be performing in our upcoming concert, <u>Enigma Variations</u>, with guest conductor Dinis Sousa at the Queen Elizabeth Hall, Southbank Centre.
